STATE OF ILLINOIS NOTICE OF REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS for the NEIGHBORHOOD STABILIZATION PROGRAM

In August 2008, the United States Congress authorized The Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) as a federal grant under the Housing and Economic Recovery Act of 2008 (HERA). The purpose of this program is to provide emergency assistance for the acquisition and redevelopment of foreclosed and abandoned properties that might otherwise become sources of abandonment and blight within their communities. The Illinois Department of Human Services (DHS), as the NSP administrator for the State, is currently seeking housing redevelopment project proposals that will help revitalize and stabilize communities that have been the most negatively impacted by foreclosures, high-risk mortgages, and high rates of abandoned or vacant properties.

The NSP funding will be used for eligible activities under the program, which include purchase and rehabilitation of foreclosed homes for resale or rental, demolition of blighted structures, provision of secondary financing for the purchase of properties, redevelopment of demolished or vacant properties, and land banking. The HERA requires that the funds be used in areas of greatest need and that they be obligated to a specific property within 18 months of receipt of funding by the State.
