President Obama signs Stimulus Bill

HUD Secretary Shaun Donovan Lays Out Agenda

In a wide-ranging speech to the assembled participants at the New York University's Furman Center for Real Estate and Urban Policy, HUD Secretary Shaun Donavan laid out an ambitious agenda for federal housing policy. Secretary Donavan framed his agenda for HUD as five areas of emphasis. The first is remaking the mortgage system. The second is addressing the "persistent rental housing crisis," including funding for the NHTF. Next is to make HUD a "force for sustainability." Four is to reinvigorate HUD's fair housing responsibilities, and finally, he wants HUD to be leader for research and evaluation. He promised that the FY2010 budget will work towards each of these.

President Obama signed the Economic Stimulus bill in Denver, Colorado, this afternoon. The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act totals \$787 billion. The Housing Provisions include:

- \$1.5 billion for Homeless Prevention
- \$4 billion for Public Housing Captial Fund
- \$2.25 billion for Project-based Housing
- \$2 billion for Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP)

• \$2.25 billion for Low Income Housing Tax Credit projects

Other HUD provisions include:

- \$1 billion for the Community Development Block Grant Program
- \$100 million for HUD's lead hazard control

• \$510 million in Native American Housing Block Grants

• \$15 million for HUD's Inspector General to ensure that the bill's funds are used in effective and efficient manner

\$200 million for Rural Housing Programs

We have to continue to advocate for affordable housing legislation. Although the Stimulus bill does include significant resources for housing programs, the bill does <u>NOT</u> include resources for the National Housing Trust Fund or for new Rental Assitance vouchers.
