



The Institute of Housing Studies at DePaul has updated its Mapping Displacement Pressure tool to reflect changes in Chicago through 2018. From IHS: "The foundation of the Mapping Displacement Pressure in Chicago tool is a demographic and socioeconomic segmentation



analysis of the City of Chicago and a geospatial housing market analysis of current and changing conditions to identify areas where residents are vulnerable to displacement in a rising cost environment and where housing costs are rising." Check it out here.
