Woodlawn Apartments to be Renamed for Mattie Butler



Two properties currently owned by POAH will be renamed after longtime community development leader and CRN board member Mattie Butler in spring 2020 in honor of her ongoing commitment to quality housing for Woodlawn's residents. In addition to leading Woodlawn East Community and Neighbors (WECAN), Mattie recently led the University of Chicago's Harris School of Public Policy in creating a parcel-by-parcel survey of all land publicly or privately owned in Woodlawn, resulting in the <u>Woodlawn</u> Housing Data Project. Pilsen Gentrification Leading to Lower School Enrollment A recent report from the Sun-Times finds that public elementary schools in Pilsen enrolled 40% fewer students this school year than they did in 2005. Carlos Ballesteros writes:

"Not too long ago, public elementary schools in Pilsen were overcrowded and underperforming. Today, it's the opposite: Despite consistent academic gains over the last decade, Pilsen's public elementary schools are losing hundreds of students a year as working-class families leave the gentrifying neighborhood in droves."
