DOH Releases 2019-Q2 Report

Class 9 Reinstatement

From the Preservation Compact:

"In the Spring, the Cook County Assessor's Office sent out letters to owners with properties eligible for Class 9 reinstatement. The letters listed specific missing documents that need to be submitted, next steps for reinstatement, and possible refunds on past tax bills."

Class 9 is designed to encourage new development, rehabilitation and long-term preservation of affordable multi-family rental housing throughout Cook County. Since spring, the Assessor's Office has processed numerous successful reinstatements and new Class 9 applications, many submitted with the help of the Preservation Compact. Chatbot Provides Free Legal Aid



Created by Lawyers' Committee for Better Housing, Illinois Legal Aid Online, and the Lawyers Trust Fund of Illinois, Rentervention is a free service that provides information for renters about issues such as evictions and maintenance issues. By asking users a series of questions, the bot determines the
